



The Aftermath Of Dorian As Seen In These Reports (9 Videos)

SouthFloridaReporter.com has been receiving a constant stream of videos from The Bahamas.

Some of the videos are courtesy of Our News Bahamas. Others are from the US Coast Guard Miami, Coast Guard Air Station Clearwater and a U.S Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Air and Marine Operations (AMO) Black Hawk.

The first video shows the dramatic rescue of several people trapped in the attic of a house. This is cell phone video that has just surfaced and received by Our News Bahamas.

A rescue mission in Freeport, Grand Bahama shows the dangerously high water and conditions the residents endured.

Abaco evacuees are grateful Thursday night to be out of what they say is a truly dreadful scene. Many of them described the atmosphere on the ground as a ticking time bomb. Our News Bahamas' Jillian Gray reports

Health Minister Dr. Duane Sands has confirmed that the death toll from Hurricane Dorian has risen to 20. Three of those persons died in Grand Bahama. Government officials expect that number to rise as rescue and recovery efforts continue.
